Iskalo Development turned off the signature tower lights at the historic Electric Tower from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 28, 2009, in support of Earth Hour 2009. The Electric Tower was bathed in green light the rest of the night to show solidarity with the green movement.

Earth Hour began in Sydney in 2007, when 2.2 million homes and businesses switched off their lights for one hour. In 2008, the message had grown into a global sustainability movement, with 50 million people switching off their lights. In 2009, Earth Hour is being taken to the next level, with the goal of 1 billion people switching off their lights. 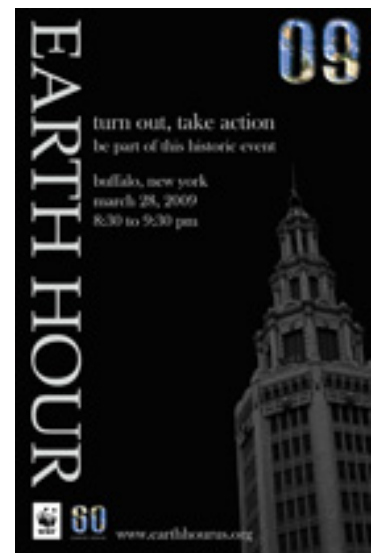
